




COVID-19 WAIVER EXTENSION

2022-23 or 2023-24 Enrollment



COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: EXTENDED



» Students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during 2022-23 or 2023-24 must meet specific criteria to be eligible.



COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: TEST SCORE



Test Score Task Force

- » Standardized test scores are excluded from NCAA initialeligibility criteria for students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during the 2022-23 or 2023-24 academic years.
 - Test Score Task Force recommendation for permanent removal will be voted on at Convention in January 2023.




COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: TEST SCORE

- » If student's first full-time enrollment period falls within an eligible academic year (2022-23 or 2023-24), may still need to take SAT/ACT:
 - Admission requirements of recruiting school.
 - Academic scholarships.



COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: DISTANCE OR E-LEARNING


» The Eligibility Center will not require a separate review of distance or e-learning programs used during the 2022-23 academic calendar in response to closures due to COVID-19.





COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: PASS/FAIL GRADES


» If the student's core-course GPA would increase by assigning a value of 2.3, this value will be assigned to the passed courses.





COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: PASS/FAIL GRADES


» Credit from these courses will still be applied toward the student's core-course requirements.






COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: APPLICATION

» Approach to pass/fail and distance/e-learning courses will apply to all students, including subsequent classes, who complete NCAA-approved core courses in the 2020-21, 2021-22 and/or 2022-23 academic years.





DIVISION I: CORE-COURSE TIME LIMITATION



» *Note:* This approach will allow students impacted by school closures to complete additional core courses toward their initial eligibility.

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER COVID-19 RESPONSE FAQ

Given the continuing impact of COVID-19 on the educational environment, the NCAA Eligibility Center has partnered with the NCAA membership to identify the following changes to the initial-eligibility certification process for students who initially enroll full time in a collegiate institution during the 2022-23 or 2023-24 academic year. The Eligibility Center will continue to monitor the environment and make necessary adjustments to prioritize health, safety and fairness for all prospective student-athletes.

COVID-19 Automatic Waiver Criteria for 2022-23 or 2023-24 Enrollment

- Q1: Given the unique circumstances due to COVID-19, will there be any flexibility in the initial-eligibility standard for students who initially enroll full time in a collegiate institution during the 2022-23 or 2023-24 academic year?
- A1: Yes. Students who initially enroll full time during 2022-23 or 2023-24 will receive an automatic initial-eligibility waiver in the academic certification process that provides the highest level of relief for which they are eligible, per the criteria below:

End of School Year



- » Upload final transcripts.
 - Include proof of graduation.
 - Can delay student's certification.
 - Received an official copy from another high school your student attended?
 - Yes—you may upload that transcript through the High School Portal.
 - > Please notify the Eligibility Center so other school's transcript can be coded correctly in the student's account.

 - "Additional Information Required" status.


CORE-COURSE REVIEW PROCESS SURVEY



Survey open until 5 p.m. Eastern time May 20. Same survey as in the April HS Newsletter.



- » Upload final transcripts.
- » Update core-course lists.
- » Request Final Amateurism.
 - Student-athletes enrolling in fall 2022.
 - Fee waivers must be resolved.
 - > Fee waiver report.
 - Resource on HS Portal, ncaa.org, emailed to eligible students.





- » Upload final transcripts.

- » Complete open tasks in high school or district accounts.
 - Can delay student certifications if not addressed before summer break.


- » High School Clarification Tasks.
 - Issue-specific clarification tasks will be soon assigned to a student's account.
 - Current language:
 - "We have received new information about your academic record" task is assigned to indicate the need for additional review.
 - > In some cases, EC staff can resolve the matter without assigning a task to a high school's account.
 - > If staff confirms additional clarification is needed, the task will stay assigned for the duration of the review.



- » High School Clarification Tasks.
 - Issue-specific clarification tasks will be soon assigned to a student's account.
 - In Development: A selection of tasks providing you and your recruit with specific details about why clarification is needed.
 - > Examples:
 - Olarification about a [specific] high school's grading scale is required.
 - Clarification about your high school's nontraditional program is required.
 - Clarification about your revised high school transcript is required.



- » MFA roll-out for Student-Athletes: Started April 29.
 - Two-step verification process for security.
 - Student-athlete questions: Refer to EC at 877-262-1492.





- » HS Advisory Groups—call for new members!
 - o 12-person group.
 - Two-year commitment.
 - Monthly one-hour virtual meetings;
 other outreach as necessary.
 - To apply, please submit resume and 500-word statement describing why you would like to serve as a member of the High School Advisory Group to ecupdate@ncaa.org.


