






COLLEGE ADMISSION

- » Apply and be accepted to the NCAA school before they can compete.
 - NCAA certification does NOT include acceptance to the NCAA school recruiting them.
- » Ask college admission about:
 - o Cost of attendance.
 - o Financial aid.
 - Standardized test scores.
 - > May be required for college admission or scholarships.
 - > NOT required for NCAA certification.

FREE PROFILE PAGE ACCOUNT

Account Type #1



The right place to start for most students!

- » Not sure in which division they plan to compete.
- » Domestic students planning to compete at a Division III school.
- » Registering in an NCAA-certified nonscholastic basketball event (BBCS, ECAG, AAU).



No registration fee.



<u>Transition</u> to the right <u>certification account</u> at any time.



ACADEMIC AND AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

Account Type #2



Required to compete at a Division I or II school.

- » Go on official visits.
- » Sign a National Letter of Intent.
- » Receive an athletics scholarship.



Registration fee:

- » Domestic students: \$100.
- » International students: \$160.



AMATEURISM-ONLY CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

Account Type #3



Required for all <u>international student-athletes</u> planning to compete at a Division III school.



Registration fee:

» \$70.



Student-athletes transferring from a two-year school to an NCAA Division I or II school who did not require an Eligibility Center academic certification.



INSTITUTIONAL REQUEST LIST

- » An IRL is a list of college-bound student-athletes an NCAA school is interested in recruiting.
 - A student must be on an NCAA school's IRL to receive an Eligibility Center certification.
 - > Receive athletics aid.
 - > Practice.
 - > Compete.



HOME SCHOOLING VERSUS SCHOOLING AT HOME

HOME SCHOOLING

Generally, if a parent/guardian or tutor creates the curriculum, provides instruction, assesses the coursework and/or awards grades and credit, the student is considered a home-schooled student-athlete.

SCHOOLING AT HOME

Learning at home does not necessarily equate to being home schooled. A student may be able to learn at home through an online school with online teachers, which would not be considered parent-directed home school.



HOME SCHOOL REGISTRATION TIPS

- » Pay special attention to questions about schools attended.
 - If home school attendance is reported during registration, four home school tasks will be assigned to the student's account.
 - Students should report all schools attended.
 - > *Note:* Many programs used by home-schooled students have accounts with the NCAA and would not require a home school review.
 - > Use school search feature to determine if an account exists.
 - Remind students to check if they meet <u>fee waiver</u> <u>criteria</u> when registering.








WHAT IS A CORE COURSE?

» Meets all requirements for an NCAA-approved core course.




» Find your <u>high school's list</u> of NCAA-approved core courses.




DIVISION I: CORE-COURSE TIME LIMITATION

Complete 10 of their 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits, including seven in English, math or science, before the start of the seventh semester.



» Once a student begins their seventh semester, any course needed to meet the 10/7 requirement cannot be replaced or repeated.









Division I CERTIFICATION OUTCOMES

- 1. Qualifier.
- 2. Academic Redshirt.
- 3. Nonqualifier.

ELIGIBILITY CENTER

» Athletics Aid. » Practice. » Compete.

DIVISION I: QUALIFIER



Complete 16 core-course units in the required subject areas.



Meet core-course progression before the seventh semester.

Note: Students certified based solely on international credentials are exempt from core-course progression.



Earn a core-course GPA ≥2.3 in the required subject areas.




Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

DIVISION I: ACADEMIC REDSHIRT




Complete 16 core-course units in the required subject areas.



Earn a core-course GPA ≥2.0 in the required subject areas.



Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.



DIVISION I: NONQUALIFIER



Nonqualifiers are not eligible to receive athletics aid, practice or compete their first year at an NCAA Division I school.

Complete 16 core-course units in the required subject areas.



Earn a core-course GPA ≥2.2 in the required subject areas.




Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

Subject Area Breakdown






DIVISION II: PARTIAL QUALIFIER

College-bound student-athletes that do not meet Division II qualifier standards will be deemed a partial qualifier.



Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

ELIGIBILITY CENTER



DIVISION III

- » Each Division III school determines its own eligibility for:
 - Academic requirements.
 - o Admission.
 - o Financial aid.
- » International student-athletes who plan to compete at a Division III school must complete an NCAA Eligibility Center Amateurism-Only Certification account.
- » Domestic student-athletes who plan to compete at a Division III school may register for a free Profile Page account, but it is not required.







HOME SCHOOL TOOLKIT

- » Best resource for home-schooled studentathletes and their families.
- » Information includes:
 - How to determine if subject to home school procedures.
 - Required home school documentation, instructions and examples.
 - Documentation submission information.
 - Additional resources and FAQs.





REQUIRED HOME SCHOOL DOCUMENTATION

- » Home school transcript.
 - Can be created/submitted by the home school administrator (parent/guardian) or an umbrella program.
- » Administrator and Accordance Statement.
 - Required for all home-schooled students, including those enrolled in an <u>umbrella program</u>.
- » Core-course worksheets.
 - Must submit a separate worksheet for each core course completed.
 - If course was completed via an online or hybrid instructional model, the <u>nontraditional</u> <u>core-course worksheet</u> should be completed.



HOME SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT


- » Must include:
 - Demographic information.
 - Academic records.
 - Signature either from the home school administrator (parent/guardian) or umbrella program administrator.

ADMINISTRATOR AND ACCORDANCE STATEMENT


- » Affirms how home school courses were completed and attests to the validity of the documentation provided.
- » Completed by the home school administrator who:
 - Manages the home school program, teaches and evaluates the coursework, and/or awards grades and issues credit.
- » Must be signed by parent/guardian.





CORE-COURSE WORKSHEETS


- » Only submitted for core courses in which parent/guardian or tutor:
 - Plans and delivers instructional activities.
 - Determines the student's comprehension of the material by grading and evaluating student performance.
 - Determines the overall grade achieved.
 - Either places the grade on a transcript/graduation report or reports the grade to a transcription agency or entity.





CORE-COURSE WORKSHEETS


- » There is no preapproved home school curriculum.
- » Worksheets are used to determine if the course meets NCAA core-course legislation.
- » Information provided on core-course worksheets is crossed checked with information on home school transcript.





NONTRADITIONAL CORE-COURSE WORKSHEETS

- » Must be submitted for all core-courses taught through a <u>nontraditional</u> home school provider.
- » Best practices:
 - Provide responses as to how the course was completed by the student.
 - Pay special attention to responses regarding the frequency and nature of student-teacher interaction.





SPECIAL SCENARIOS

- » Pre-ninth grade coursework.
 - Course taken prior to ninth grade may be used if course:
 - > Appears on the home school transcript with grade and high school credit awarded.
 - > Meets core-course requirements.
 - Core-course worksheets are required for pre-ninth grade courses taken via home school.



SPECIAL SCENARIOS

- » College coursework.
 - Dual-enrollment courses may be used if course:
 - > Appears on home school transcript with grade and high school credit awarded.
 - > Meets core-course requirements.
 - Dual-enrollment home school transcript must also be provided.
 - No core-course worksheets are required.



HOME SCHOOL DOCUMENTATION REMINDERS

- » All forms/worksheets must be:
 - Created by the NCAA Eligibility Center.
 - Completed in their entirety.
 - > Do not modify/edit/change forms.
 - Signed by parent/guardian.
 - **Exception:** Transcripts provided by umbrella programs may be signed by umbrella program administrator.
- » Documentation provided may not include embedded links.
- » Insufficient/incomplete documentation may be:
 - Deemed unofficial and a task may be assigned to student account for clarification.



HOME SCHOOL DOCUMENTATION REMINDERS

- » Documentation submission guidelines:
 - o Can send via:
 - > **Best practice:** Email as attachment.
 - > Standard delivery, overnight or express mail.
 - Documents <u>CANNOT</u> be sent via Adobe EchoSign or Dropbox.
 - Parent/guardian or home school umbrella programs can submit home school student transcripts.
 - All other home school documentation must be provided by the home school administrator (e.g., parent/guardian).
 - Be sure to include student-athlete's NCAA ID with all submitted student records.
